NRC ADVISORY COMMITTEE ON REACTOR SAFEGUARDS TO MEET JULY 14-16 IN ROCKVILLE, MD.

The Nuclear Regulatory Commission's Advisory Committee on Reactor Safeguards (ACRS) will hold a public meeting July 14-16 in Rockville, Md., to discuss several issues of interest. Topics include: the safety evaluation report for the South Texas Project combined license application; regulatory guidance for fuel cycle facility change processes; seismic input for site response and soil structure analyses; the implementation of seismic margin analysis for new reactors; and the quality assessment of selected NRC research projects. In addition, representatives of the Nuclear Energy Institute will discuss with the Committee items of mutual interest.

The ACRS, a group of experienced technical experts, advises the Commission independently from the NRC staff on safety issues related to the licensing and operation of nuclear power plants. It also advises the Commission on issues in health physics and radiation protection.

The meeting will be held in Room T2-B1 in the Two White Flint North building at NRC Headquarters at 11545 Rockville Pike, Rockville, Md. The sessions on July 14 and 15 will run from 8:30 a.m. to 7 p.m., and on July 16 from 12 to 2:30 p.m.

Portions of the meeting may be closed to discuss information that includes classified, proprietary, or personnel matters.
