CLIMATE CHANGE ADAPTATION POLICY STATEMENT
June 2, 2011

The U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission's (NRC) mission is to license and regulate the Nation's civilian use of byproduct, source, and special nuclear materials, to ensure adequate protection of public health and safety, to promote the common defense and security, and to protect the environment.

It is the policy of NRC to carry out its operations in such a way as to maintain a safe and healthy work environment for building occupants. The NRC will ensure that adequate building services are provided to maintain optimum operational readiness to conduct our mission. The NRC recognizes that planning for climate change in conjunction with meeting energy usage and greenhouse gas reduction targets will aid the Federal government in reducing the consequences of climate changes caused by our operations.

The NRC adaptation planning and implementation resources are integrated into the mission of the Office of Administration and will be directed through the Division of Facilities and Security. Actions taken will be done in coordination with other Federal agencies.
