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NRC RECEIVES TOP-NOTCH RANKINGS FROM ANNUAL SURVEY

For the second year in a row, the Nuclear Regulatory Commission ranked No. 1 in all four categories of the Office of Personnel Management's Federal Employee Viewpoint Survey released today. The four categories are leadership and knowledge management, results-oriented performance culture, talent management, and job satisfaction.

"These outstanding results are a testament to the NRC staff's professionalism and dedication to our safety and security mission," said Chairman Gregory Jaczko. "We are committed to building on these strong results in the future so that we continue to be an effective safety and security regulator."

The annual Federal Employee Viewpoint Survey evaluates the management leadership, employee satisfaction, and organizational culture of federal agencies. Specifically, it measures employees' perception of whether, and to what extent, their organizations have the types of characteristics typically associated with high-performing, successful organizations.

This effort demonstrates the strong commitment across the federal government in trying to find ways to better serve the American people.

"While everyone here at the NRC is very proud of these results, we plan to identify those areas where we can continue to make further improvements to enhance the work environment for all employees," said NRC's Chief Human Capital Officer Miriam Cohen.
