By the Reference letter dated August 30, 2012, as supplemented on October 1, 2012, and December 20, 2012 (December 20 Letter), Shaw AREVA MOX Services, LLC (MOX Services) requested that the U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission (the NRC) consent to the indirect transfer of control of Construction Authorization No. CAMOX-001 (the CA) for the Mixed Oxide Fuel Fabrication Facility (MOX Facility) now being constructed at the U.S. Department of Energy (DOE) Savannah River Site in Aiken, South Carolina. The indirect transfer would result from a proposed transaction whereby The Shaw Group Inc. (Shaw) would be acquired by and become a wholly owned subsidiary of Chicago Bridge & Iron Company N.V. (CB&I).

As discussed in the December 20 Letter, MOX Services holds a Facility Security Clearance (FCL) administered by the DOE/National Nuclear Security Administration (NNSA), and that a proxy agreement will be established in accordance with the National Industrial Security Program (NISP). The proxy agreement will address governance of Shaw Project Services Group, Inc. (SPSG) and MOX Services. The December 20 Letter further explained that Shaw was considering conversion of SPSG from a Delaware corporation to a Delaware limited liability company. That conversion would occur by operation of Delaware law based upon a filing with the Delaware Secretary of State. The corporate entity would remain the same, but with the new corporate form and new name of Shaw Project Services Group, LLC.

The purpose of this letter is to inform the NRC that the conversion of the corporate form of SPSG (and conforming name change) occurred on January 15, 2013. As previously

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stated in the December 20 Letter, the conversion does not alter the corporate ownership structure or alter the obligations under and protections afforded by the proxy agreement.
