Upon receipt of your request, we reached out to staff in the Office of Nuclear Reactor Regulation (NRR) that work most closely with INPO. NRR staff informed us that, about seven years ago, NRC staff and INPO reviewed the latter's older documents to determine which ones remained active. and, accordingly, should be retained. For the documents identified as active, they were uploaded to the NRC's official recordkeeping repository, Agencywide Documents Access and Management System (ADAMS). NRR staff did not retain paper copies of this report. Nor did our search of ADAMS locate the record. Finally, we had tasked the Library's Records staff to search any archived paper records; they informed us that they did not maintain INPO records either.
