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## PART I.D -- COMMENTS

Upon receipt of your request, our office tasked the following program offices within NRC's headquarters: Office of Administration (ADM), Office of Nuclear Material Safety and Safeguards (NMSS), Office of International Programs (OIP), and the Office of Nuclear Reactor Regulation (NRR).

None of the offices we tasked to search located any records responsive to your request. OIP staff offered the following information, which may be helpful to you. With respect to the first part of your request, even though the NRC is the licensing authority for imports of uranium, NRC does not request, require, or otherwise consider the contracts related to the purchase of uranium, so the NRC does not receive those kinds of documents. With respect to the second part of your request, even though the NRC is the licensing authority for imports of uranium, uranium is imported under a general license pursuant to 10 CFR 110.27, and therefore no specific license or paperwork is received or processed by the NRC for those imports.

OIP staff suggested that, if you have not already done so, you may wish to submit your FOIA request to the Department of Energy (DOE) or Customs and Border Protection (CBP).
