Dear Mr. Densmore:

In mid-2011, Exelon Generation Company, LLC (Exelon Generation; a subsidiary of Exelon Corporation) plans to apply to the U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission (NRC) for renewal of the operating licenses for Limerick Generating Station, Units 1 and 2 (LGS). The existing license for Unit 1 will expire on October 26, 2024 and the existing license for Unit 2 will expire on June 22, 2029. The renewal term for each unit would be an additional twenty years beyond the existing license expiration date.

The NRC requires that license renewal applications include environmental reports assessing potential environmental impacts from license renewal activities. One such impact would be effects of license renewal activities on threatened and endangered species that are listed or proposed for listing in accordance with the Endangered Species Act (ESA) (16 USC 1531, et seq.) (10 CFR 51.53(c)(3)(ii)(E)). Accordingly, we are contacting you to obtain input for use in addressing these effects in the LGS license renewal environmental report. Later, NRC may also request an informal consultation with your office under Section 7 of the ESA (16 USC 1536(a)).

Project Features

LGS existing features that are relevant to the effects of license renewal on threatened and endangered species include the following:

 The LGS plant site, which hosts the two generating units, is located on Exelon Generation-owned properties that are mostly situated in Limerick Township, Montgomery County, but some of which are in the adjacent Lower Pottsgrove Township, Montgomery County or directly across the Schuylkill River in East Coventry Township, Chester County.

- 2. The LGS makeup water supply system, which conveys water from approved sources to LGS for use in its circulating water system, is composed of the following components:
 - The Perkiomen Pumphouse, located in Graterford Township, Montgomery County, and an associated underground 7.6-mile long Perkiomen Pumphouse-to-LGS pipeline; both are located along an easement held by Exelon Generation within an electrical transmission line right-of-way (ROW) controlled by PECO, a subsidiary of Exelon Corporation;
 - The Bradshaw Reservoir and Bradshaw Pumphouse, which are both situated in Plumstead Township, Bucks County, on Exelon Generation-owned properties totaling 42 acres;
 - The Bedminster Water Processing (Treatment) Facility, which is situated in Bedminster Township, Bucks County, on a 3-acre Exelon Generation-owned property; and
 - An underground water transmission main, which is routed within a natural gas
 pipeline ROW along an easement held by Exelon Generation that runs from the
 Bradshaw Pumphouse to the East Branch Perkiomen Creek by way of the
 Bedminster Facility.

The buried Perkiomen Pumphouse-to-LGS water pipeline and the underground water transmission main are located below ground within ROWs that exist for other purposes, and their operation requires no independent vegetation management or ground disturbing activities along these ROWs. Hence, these underground components of the makeup water supply system are assumed to have no effects on threatened and endangered plant species.

- 3. The LGS transmission system is composed of the following components:
 - Two electrical transmission lines constructed to connect the LGS main power transformers with two onsite electrical substations (these components are located on the LGS plant site); and
 - Four 230-kiloVolt (kV) and one 500-kV electrical transmission lines, with associated structures and offsite electrical substations, constructed to connect the onsite electrical substations to the regional electricity grid.

All offsite substations and transmission lines are operated by PECO and are located in ROWs situated in Montgomery and Chester Counties either on PECO-owned properties or on properties for which PECO holds permits, grants, easements, or licenses. Onsite transmission lines traverse only land disturbed during initial station construction.


Figure 1	LGS Plant Site Property Boundaries

Figures 1 through 9 showing the locations of the existing LGS project features are provided in Attachment 3.

Activities During the License Renewal Terms

LGS license renewal will involve no new construction, refurbishment, ground disturbing activities, changes to operations, or changes to existing land-use conditions. Operation and maintenance activities during the terms of the renewed LGS licenses are only expected to occur in previously disturbed areas or existing ROWs. Hence, no new adverse impacts to threatened and endangered species are anticipated from license renewal.

Identification of Threatened and Endangered Species Resources

Using the Pennsylvania Natural Diversity Inventory (PNDI), Environmental Review Tool, a web-based application sponsored by the Pennsylvania Natural Heritage Program (PNHP), Exelon generation has reviewed the potential for the LGS plant site area and the properties associated with the LGS makeup water supply system to adversely affect known occurrences of species or natural communities of concern. Receipts for PNDI search #s 20100421240174 (LGS plant site), 20100421240163 (Perkiomen Pumphouse area), 20100406237563 (Bradshaw Reservoir and Pumphouse area), and 20100407237630 (Bedminster Water Processing Facility area) are attached (Attachment 1). The receipts indicate that no impacts to federally listed or proposed species and/or special concern species or resources within the jurisdiction of the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service (USFWS) will occur at the four project areas.

Given the sizable acreage and distances associated with the LGS transmission line corridors, no PNDI searches were conducted for this project component. For review by your office in identifying species of concern, we instead offer the figures in Attachment 3 showing the routes and widths of the corridors.

A review of the PNHP web site for state-listed endangered and threatened species indicates that several state-listed species could occur in Montgomery, Chester, and Bucks Counties and that these are also federally-listed or proposed species. Attachment 2 contains a list of these species. Exelon Generation is not aware that these have ever been observed on or near the properties associated with LGS or its associated transmission lines. Also, Exelon Generation and PECO adhere to regulatory requirements regarding sensitive areas that could contain listed threatened and endangered species and work closely with your office to protect these resources.

Because license renewal involves no new construction, refurbishment, ground disturbing activities, changes to operation, or changes to existing land use conditions, Exelon Generation does not expect LGS license renewal to adversely affect federally threatened and endangered species located near the LGS plant site, makeup water supply system, or transmission system ROWs. Nevertheless, we are requesting your help to identify issues we may have overlooked that need to be addressed in the LGS license renewal environmental report. We are also interested in learning of any information your staff believes could help expedite the NRC's review of the LGS license renewal application. Hence, in closing, we would appreciate receiving a response from you detailing such issues and information for the LGS plant site, makeup water supply system and transmission system. We would also welcome your confirmation of our conclusion that LGS license renewal would not adversely affect threatened and endangered species.

Because we plan to incorporate a copy of your response, as well as this letter, into the LGS license renewal environmental report that will be submitted to the NRC as part of the LGS license renewal application, your response will be most helpful if we receive it by March 10, 2011.

Request for Information on Listed Threatened and Endangered Species

Dear Ms. Firestone:

In mid-2011, Exelon Generation Company, LLC (Exelon Generation; a subsidiary of Exelon Corporation) plans to apply to the U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission (NRC) for renewal of the operating licenses for Limerick Generating Station, Units 1 and 2 (LGS). The existing license for Unit 1 will expire on October 26, 2024 and the existing license for Unit 2 will expire on June 22, 2029. The renewal term for each unit would be an additional twenty years beyond the existing license expiration date.

The NRC requires that license renewal applications include environmental reports assessing potential environmental impacts from license renewal activities. One such impact would be effects of license renewal activities on threatened and endangered species that are listed or proposed for listing in accordance with the Endangered Species Act (ESA) (16 USC 1531, et seq.) (10 CFR 51.53(c)(3)(ii)(E)). Accordingly, we are contacting you to obtain input for use in addressing these effects in the LGS license renewal environmental report. Later, NRC may also request an informal consultation with your office consistent with Section 7 of the ESA (16 USC 1536(a)).

Project Features

LGS existing features that are relevant to the effects of license renewal on threatened and endangered species include the following:

- The LGS plant site, which hosts the two generating units, is located on Exelon Generation-owned properties that are mostly situated in Limerick Township, Montgomery County, but some of which are in the adjacent Lower Pottsgrove Township, Montgomery County or directly across the Schuylkill River in East Coventry Township, Chester County.
- 2. The LGS makeup water supply system, which conveys water from approved sources to LGS for use in its circulating water system, is composed of the following components:
 - The Perkiomen Pumphouse, located in Graterford Township, Montgomery County, and an associated underground 7.6-mile long Perkiomen Pumphouse-to-LGS pipeline; both are located along an easement held by Exelon Generation within an electrical transmission line right-of-way (ROW) controlled by PECO, a subsidiary of Exelon Corporation;
 - The Bradshaw Reservoir and Bradshaw Pumphouse, which are both situated in Plumstead Township, Bucks County, on Exelon Generation-owned properties totaling 42 acres;
 - The Bedminster Water Processing Facility, which is situated in Bedminster Township, Bucks County, on a 3-acre Exelon Generation-owned property; and
 - An underground water transmission main, which is routed within a natural gas pipeline ROW along an easement held by Exelon Generation that runs from the Bradshaw Pumphouse to the East Branch Perkiomen Creek by way of the Bedminster Facility.

The buried Perkiomen Pumphouse-to-LGS water pipeline and the underground water transmission main are located below ground within ROWs that exist for other purposes, and their operation requires no independent vegetation management or ground disturbing activities along these ROWs. Hence, these underground components of the makeup water supply system are assumed to have no effects on threatened and endangered plant species.

- 3. The LGS transmission system is composed of the following components:
 - Two electrical transmission lines constructed to connect the LGS main power transformers with two onsite electrical substations (these components are located on the LGS plant site); and
 - Four 230-kiloVolt (kV) and one 500-kV electrical transmission lines, with associated structures and offsite electrical substations, constructed to connect the onsite electrical substations to the regional electricity grid.

All offsite substations and transmission lines are operated by PECO and are located in ROWs situated in Montgomery and Chester Counties either on PECO-owned properties or on properties for which PECO holds permits, grants, easements, or licenses. Onsite transmission lines traverse only land that was disturbed during initial station construction.


Figure 1	LGS Plant Site Property Boundaries

Figures 1 through 9 showing the locations of the existing LGS project features are provided in Attachment 3.

Activities During the License Renewal Terms

LGS license renewal will involve no new construction, refurbishment, ground disturbing activities, changes to operations, or changes to existing land-use conditions. Operation and maintenance activities during the terms of the renewed LGS licenses are only expected to occur in previously disturbed areas or existing ROWs. Hence, no new adverse impacts to threatened and endangered plant species are anticipated from license renewal.

Identification of Threatened and Endangered Species Resources

Using the Pennsylvania Natural Diversity Inventory (PNDI) Environmental Review Tool, a web-based application sponsored by the Pennsylvania Natural Heritage Program (PNHP), Exelon Generation has reviewed the potential for the LGS plant site area and the properties associated with the LGS makeup water supply system to adversely affect known occurrences of species or natural communities of concern. Receipts for PNDI search #s 20100421240174 (LGS plant site), 20100421240163 (Perkiomen Pumphouse area), 20100406237563 (Bradshaw Reservoir and Pumphouse area), and 20100407237630 (Bedminster Water Processing Facility area) are attached (Attachment 1). One "Special Concern Species" was identified for the LGS plant site: tooth-cup (*Rotala ramosior*). The responses for the other project sites stated that no impact is anticipated to threatened and endangered species and/or special concern species or resources.

Given the sizable acreage and distances associated with the LGS transmission line corridors, no PNDI searches were conducted for this project component. For review by your office in identifying species of concern, we instead offer the figures in Attachment 3 showing the routes and widths of the corridors.

A review of the PNHP web site for state-listed endangered and threatened species indicates that numerous state-listed plant species could occur in Montgomery, Chester, and Bucks Counties. The enclosed Attachment 2 contains a list of these species. One perennial orchid species, the small whorled pogonia (*Isotria medeoloides*), state-listed as endangered, with Chester County as its recorded location, also is federally-listed as threatened. Although the American Holly (*Ilex opaca*), which is state-listed as threatened, was observed on the LGS plant site in 1978, Exelon Generation is not aware of the recent presence of any state-listed plant species on or near the properties associated with LGS and its associated transmission lines. Also, Exelon Generation and PECO adhere to regulatory requirements regarding sensitive areas that could contain state-listed threatened and endangered plant species and work closely with your department to protect these resources.

Because license renewal involves no new construction, refurbishment, ground disturbing activities, changes to operation, or changes to existing land use conditions, Exelon Generation does not expect LGS license renewal to adversely affect threatened and endangered plant species located near the LGS plant site, makeup water supply system, or transmission system ROWs. Nevertheless, we are requesting your help to identify issues we may have overlooked that need to be addressed in the LGS license renewal environmental report. We are also interested in learning of any information your staff believes could help expedite the NRC's review of the LGS license renewal application. Hence, in closing, we would appreciate receiving a response from you detailing such issues and information for the LGS plant site, makeup water supply system and transmission system. We would also welcome your confirmation of our conclusion that LGS license renewal would not adversely affect threatened and endangered plant species.

Because we plan to incorporate a copy of your response, as well as this letter, into the LGS license renewal environmental report that will be submitted to the NRC as part of the LGS license renewal application, your response will be most helpful if we receive it by March 10, 2011.

Dear Mr. Gallagher,

Thank you for your submission of the Pennsylvania Natural Diversity Inventory (PNDI) Environmental Review Large Project Number 21136 for review. PA Department of Conservation and Natural Resources screened this project for potential impacts to species and resources of concern under DCNR's responsibility, which includes plants, terrestrial invertebrates, natural communities, and geologic features only.

No Impact Anticipated

PNDI records indicate species or resources of concern are located in the vicinity of the project. However, since the renewal does not involve new construction, refurbishment, ground disturbance, changes to operations or existing land use conditions, DCNR has determined that no impact is likely to occur to species of special concern under our jurisdiction as a result of this project.

For your information, we have included details on the species of special concern which are known near the rights of way of the LGS transmission corridors. If plans change to include earth disturbance in these locations, please coordinate with us further.

Limerick to Cromby 230kV Transmission Line Route

Rotala ramosior (Tooth-cup, PA Rare): habitat is described in Plants of PA, by Rhoads and Block as wet, sandy shores and other swampy open ground; flowers July-Sept. Tooth-cup is known in a wet wooded stretch along the west side of the Schuylkill River.

Cyperus schweinitzii (Schweintiz's flatsedge, PA Rare): habitat includes dry or moist sand flats and dunes; flowering and fruiting time is mid-summer to early fall. Schweinitz's flatsedge was found in association with Tooth-cup in a wet wooded area along the west side of the Schuylkill River.

Arabis missouriensis (Missouri rock-cress, PA Endangered): habitat includes dry slopes; flowers Aprilearly June. Missouri rock-cress was found nearby in a dry forested slope with scattered outcrops of Brunswick red shale. If work is planned (especially ROW widening) in the future for the eastern Limerick –Cromby 220-60 Line, please coordinate with us further.

Arabis patens (Spreading rock-cress, Currently Unlisted, Proposed PA Threatened): habitat is moist, rocky woods; flowers April-July. Spreading rock cress was found nearby in a shaded NW-facing rock face.

- **Ranunculus fascicularis** (Tufted buttercup, PA Endangered): habitat includes dry, think woods and exposed calcareious slopes and edges; flowers April-May. Tufted buttercup was found nearby in a ridgetop glade near trails in a state park.

Cromby to Plymouth Meeting 230kV Transmission Line Route

- Arabis patens (Spreading rock-cress, Currently Unlisted, Proposed PA Threatened): habitat is moist, rocky woods; flowers April-July. Spreading rock cress was found nearby in a shaded NW-facing rock face.
- Andropogon gyrans (Elliott's beardgrass, Currently unlisted, Proposed PA Rare): habitat is dry or moist fields or open woods; flowering time is September to October. Elliott's beardgrass was found nearby in an old field.
- Cuscuta campestris (Dodder, Currently Unlisted, Proposed PA Threatened): habitat includes thickets and waste ground, parasitic on wild and cultivated hosts; flowers June-September, fruits July-October. This dodder species was previously found in an old impounding basin, near the Schuylkill River.
- **Rotala ramosior** (Tooth-cup, PA Rare): habitat includes wet, sandy shores and other swampy open ground; flowers July-Sept. This population of Tooth-cup was found on an exposed mud flat and sandy-cobbly shores of seasonally flooded shallow basins.

Limerick to Whitpain Meeting 500kV Transmission Line Route

- Ranunculus fascicularis (Tufted buttercup, PA Endangered): habitat includes dry, think woods and exposed calcareious slopes and edges; flowers April-May. Tufted buttercup was found nearby in a ridgetop glade near trails in a state park.
- *Iris prismatica* (Slender Blue Iris, PA Endangered): habitat is moist meadows and sandy or gravelly shores; flowering time is late May-June. Slender blue iris was found nearby in gently sloping land, open with scattered red maples in a mossy floodplain of the Perkiomen Creek.

This response represents the most up-to-date summary of the PNDI data files and is <u>valid for one (1) year</u> from the date of this letter. An absence of recorded information does not necessarily imply actual conditions on-site. Should project plans change or additional information on listed or proposed species become available, this determination may be reconsidered. Should the proposed work continue beyond the period covered by this letter, please resubmit the project to this agency as an "Update" (including an updated PNDI receipt, project narrative and accurate map).

This finding applies to impacts to DCNR only. To complete your review of state and federally-listed threatened and endangered species and species of special concern, please be sure the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service, PA Game Commission, and the Pennsylvania Fish and Boat Commission have been contacted regarding this project as directed by the online PNDI ER Tool found at www.naturalheritage.state.pa.us.

Request for Information on Listed Threatened and Endangered Species

Dear Mr. Leigey:

In mid-2011, Exelon Generation Company, LLC (Exelon Generation; a subsidiary of Exelon Corporation) plans to apply to the U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission (NRC) for renewal of the operating licenses for Limerick Generating Station, Units 1 and 2 (LGS). The existing license for Unit 1 will expire on October 26, 2024 and the existing license for Unit 2 will expire on June 22, 2029. The renewal term for each unit would be an additional twenty years beyond the existing license expiration date.

The NRC requires that license renewal applications include environmental reports assessing potential environmental impacts from license renewal activities. One such impact would be effects of license renewal activities on threatened and endangered species that are listed or proposed for listing in accordance with the Endangered Species Act (ESA) (16 USC 1531, et seq.) (10 CFR 51.53(c)(3)(ii)(E)). Accordingly, we are contacting you to obtain input for use in addressing these effects in the LGS license renewal environmental report. Later, NRC may also request an informal consultation with your office under Section 7 of the ESA (16 USC 1536(a)).

Project Features

LGS existing features that are relevant to the effects of license renewal on threatened and endangered species include the following:

 The LGS plant site, which hosts the two generating units, is located on Exelon Generation-owned properties that are mostly situated in Limerick Township, Montgomery County, but some of which are in the adjacent Lower Pottsgrove Township, Montgomery County or directly across the Schuylkill River in East Coventry Township, Chester County.

- 2. The LGS makeup water supply system, which conveys water from approved sources to LGS for use in its circulating water system, is composed of the following components:
 - The Perkiomen Pumphouse, located in Graterford Township, Montgomery County, and an associated underground 7.6-mile long Perkiomen Pumphouse-to-LGS pipeline; both are located along an easement held by Exelon Generation within an electrical transmission line right-of-way (ROW) controlled by PECO, a subsidiary of Exelon Corporation;
 - The Bradshaw Reservoir and Bradshaw Pumphouse, which are both situated in Plumstead Township, Bucks County, on Exelon Generation-owned properties totaling 42 acres;
 - The Bedminster Water Processing (Treatment) Facility, which is situated in Bedminster Township, Bucks County, on a 3-acre Exelon Generation-owned property; and
 - An underground water transmission main, which is routed within a natural gas pipeline ROW along an easement held by Exelon Generation that runs from the Bradshaw Pumphouse to the East Branch Perkiomen Creek by way of the Bedminster Facility.

The buried Perkiomen Pumphouse-to-LGS water pipeline and the underground water transmission main are located below ground within ROWs that exist for other purposes, and their operation requires no independent vegetation management or ground disturbing activities along these ROWs. Hence, these underground components of the makeup water supply system are assumed to have no effects on threatened and endangered plant species.

- 3. The LGS transmission system is composed of the following components:
 - Two electrical transmission lines constructed to connect the LGS main power transformers with two onsite electrical substations (these components are located on the LGS plant site); and
 - o Four 230-kiloVolt (kV) and one 500-kV electrical transmission lines, with associated structures and offsite electrical substations, constructed to connect the onsite electrical substations to the regional electricity grid.

All offsite substations and transmission lines are operated by PECO and are located in ROWs situated in Montgomery and Chester Counties either on PECO-owned properties or on properties for which PECO holds permits, grants, easements, or licenses. Onsite transmission lines traverse only land disturbed during initial station construction.


Figure 1	LGS Plant Site Property Boundaries

Figures 1 through 9 showing the locations of the existing LGS project features are provided in Attachment 3.

Activities During the License Renewal Terms

LGS license renewal will involve no new construction, refurbishment, ground disturbing activities, changes to operations, or changes to existing land-use conditions. Operation and maintenance activities during the terms of the renewed LGS licenses are only expected to occur

in previously disturbed areas or existing ROWs. Hence, no new adverse impacts to threatened and endangered species are anticipated from license renewal.

Identification of Threatened and Endangered Species Resources

Using the Pennsylvania Natural Diversity Inventory (PNDI) Environmental Review Tool, a web-based application sponsored by the Pennsylvania Natural Heritage Program (PNHP), Exelon Generation has reviewed the potential for the LGS plant site area and the properties associated with the LGS makeup water supply system to adversely affect known occurrences of species or natural communities of concern. Receipts for PNDI search #s 20100421240174 (LGS plant site), 20100421240163 (Perkiomen Pumphouse area), 20100406237563 (Bradshaw Reservoir and Pumphouse area), and 20100407237630 (Bedminster Water Processing Facility area) are attached (Attachment 1). The responses for the four project sites stated that no impact is anticipated to threatened and endangered species and/or special concern species or resources.

Given the sizable acreage and distances associated with the LGS transmission line corridors, no PNDI searches were conducted for this project component. For review by your office in identifying species of concern, we instead offer the figures in Attachment 3 showing the routes and widths of the corridors.

A review of the PNHP web site for state-listed endangered and threatened species indicates that a number of state-listed mammal and bird species could occur in Montgomery, Chester, and Bucks Counties. The enclosed Attachment 2 contains a list of these species. One mammal species, the Indiana bat (Myotis sodalis), state-listed as endangered with recorded locations in the three counties of interest, also is federally-listed as endangered. Although the following birds that are state-listed as threatened or endangered were observed on one or more occasions at the LGS plant site during surveys conducted from 1972 to 1985, Exelon Generation is not aware that these or any other state-listed mammal or bird species have been recently present on or near the properties associated with LGS or its associated transmission lines: American bittern (Botaurus lentiginosus), Great egret (Casmerodius albus), Blackpoll warbler (Dendroica striata), Yellow-bellied flycatcher (Empidonax flaviventris), Peregrine falcon (Falco peregrinus), Bald eagle (Haliaeetus leucocephalus), Least bittern (Ixobrychus exilis), Yellow-crowned night heron (Nyctanassa violacea), Black-crowned night heron (Nycticorax nycticorax), and Osprey (Pandion haliaetus). Also, Exelon Generation and PECO adhere to regulatory requirements regarding sensitive areas that could contain state-listed threatened and endangered plant species and work closely with your department to protect these resources.

Because license renewal involves no new construction, refurbishment, ground disturbing activities, changes to operation, or changes to existing land use conditions, Exelon Generation does not expect LGS license renewal to adversely affect threatened and endangered mammal and bird species located near the LGS plant site, makeup water supply system, or transmission system ROWs. Nevertheless, we are requesting your help to identify issues we may have overlooked that need to be addressed in the LGS license renewal environmental report. We are also interested in learning of any information your staff believes could help expedite the NRC's review of the LGS license renewal application. Hence, in closing, we would appreciate receiving a response from you detailing such issues and information for the LGS plant site, makeup water supply system and transmission system. We would also welcome your confirmation of our conclusion that LGS license renewal would not adversely affect threatened and endangered mammal and bird species.

Because we plan to incorporate a copy of your response, as well as this letter, into the LGS license renewal environmental report that will be submitted to the NRC as part of the LGS license renewal application, your response will be most helpful if we receive it by March 10, 2011.

In a letter dated January 20, 2011 from Michael P. The purpose of this letter is to provide additional information about the transmission system feature of the LGS License Renewal Project, as you requested during a telephone call with me on February 8, 2011.

The transmission system feature of the LGS License Renewal Project consists of corridors for four 230-kilovolt (kV) and one 500-kV electrical transmission lines that were originally constructed to connect the electrical substations located on the LGS plant site to the regional electricity grid via several intermediate electrical substations. Figures showing routing information for the relevant transmission corridors were enclosed with our January 20, 2011 letter. However, we now understand that a completed PNDI "Large Project" Planning and Environmental Review Form should also have been submitted because the transmission corridors are too large/long for a search to be performed using the online PNDI system. Accordingly, a completed "Large Project" form for the transmission system feature is attached to this letter. In order to facilitate your review, I am also forwarding by e-mail GIS (computer shape) files showing the transmission corridor boundaries, in lieu of the USGS 7.5 minute quadrangle maps requested on the form.

Electrical substations and transmission lines within the transmission system feature of the LGS License Renewal Project that are located off the LGS plant site are owned and operated by PECO within rights-of-way (ROWs) situated in Montgomery and Chester Counties either on PECO-owned properties or on properties for which PECO holds permits, grants, easements, or licenses. PECO implements existing vegetation management and environmental protection programs for these substations and ROWs (details available upon request). The LGS License Renewal Project will not alter these existing programs or involve any new construction, refurbishment, ground disturbing activities, changes to operations, or changes to existing landuse conditions at offsite substations and ROWs. Onsite substations and transmission lines traverse only land disturbed during initial plant construction. Hence, onsite operation and maintenance activities during the terms of the renewed LGS licenses are only expected to

occur in previously disturbed areas. For these reasons, no adverse impacts to threatened and endangered species in any transmission corridors are anticipated from license renewal. Nevertheless, we are requesting your help to identify issues we may have overlooked that need to be addressed in the LGS license renewal environmental report. We are also interested in learning of any information your staff believes could help expedite the NRC's review of the LGS license renewal application.

Exelon Generation understands that, because the PNDI search documentation for the plant site and makeup water system features of the LGS License Renewal Project (submitted to PGC with the January 20, 2011 letter) indicates that no further PGC review would be required for those features, PGC will not respond to our January 20, 2011 letter. Notwithstanding, we will incorporate into the LGS license renewal environmental report copies of our January 20, 2011 letter, as well as copies of this letter and your response regarding the transmission system feature of the project.

In closing, we would appreciate receiving a response from you detailing any issues and information concerning effects of the transmission system feature of the LGS License Renewal Project on threatened and endangered species. We would also welcome your confirmation of our conclusion that LGS license renewal would not adversely affect threatened and endangered mammal and bird species. To support our schedule for submitting the LGS License Renewal Application to the NRC in June 2011, your response will be most helpful if we receive it by March 25, 2011.

Thank you for submitting your Pennsylvania Natural Diversity Inventory (PNDI) Large Project Environmental Review request. The Pennsylvania Game Commission (PGC) screened this project for potential impacts to species and resources of concern under PGC responsibility, which includes birds and mammals only.

Potential Impact Anticipated

PNDI records indicate species or resources of concern are located in the vicinity of the project. However, based on the fact that the project will involve no new construction and/or tree clearing, that any/all related maintenance activities will be restricted to the existing right-of-way corridors, the immediate location of the project area, and our detailed resource information, the PGC has determined that no impacts to state listed threatened or endangered bird or mammal species are likely.

However, it appears that portions of the above referenced project are located within close proximity to State Game Lands # 234. Please contact Mr. Bruce Metz, Land Management Supervisor, at (610) 926-3136 to discuss the project activities and coordinate obtaining the necessary approvals if your project will impact State Game Lands. It is recommended that you coordinate with Game Commission Staff early in your project planning process.

This response represents the most up-to-date summary of the PNDI data files and is <u>valid for one</u> (1) year from the date of this letter. An absence of recorded information does not necessarily imply actual conditions on site. Should project plans change or additional information on listed or proposed species become available, this determination may be reconsidered.

Should the proposed work continue beyond the period covered by this letter, please resubmit the project to this agency as an "Update" (including an updated PNDI receipt, project narrative and accurate map). If the proposed work has not changed and no additional information concerning

In mid-2011, Exelon Generation Company, LLC (Exelon Generation; a subsidiary of Exelon Corporation) plans to apply to the U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission (NRC) for renewal of the operating licenses for Limerick Generating Station, Units 1 and 2 (LGS). The existing license for Unit 1 will expire on October 26, 2024 and the existing license for Unit 2 will expire on June 22, 2029. The renewal term for each unit would be an additional twenty years beyond the existing license expiration date.

The NRC requires that license renewal applications include environmental reports assessing potential environmental impacts from license renewal activities. One such impact would be effects of license renewal activities, which include continued operation of certain transmission lines that connect the power plant to the regional electrical grid, on Pennsylvania State Game Lands. Attachment 1 to this letter illustrates the proximity of the LGS transmission lines to State Game Lands.

The purpose of this letter is to confirm the telephone conversation held on April 7, 2011 between you and Mr. Robert Tarr regarding possible effects on State Game Land #234 of continued operation after license renewal of the LGS transmission lines. During the conversation, you indicated that the renewal of the LGS operating licenses would have no impact to State Game Land #234 because license renewal will involve no new construction and/or tree clearing, and the Limerick-Cromby Transmission Line 220-60 runs adjacent to, but not through State Game Lands #234.



Request for Information on Listed Threatened and Endangered Species

Dear Mr. Urban:

In mid-2011, Exelon Generation Company, LLC (Exelon Generation; a subsidiary of Exelon Corporation) plans to apply to the U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission (NRC) for renewal of the operating licenses for Limerick Generating Station, Units 1 and 2 (LGS). The existing license for Unit 1 will expire on October 26, 2024 and the existing license for Unit 2 will expire on June 22, 2029. The renewal term for each unit would be an additional twenty years beyond the existing license expiration date.

The NRC requires that license renewal applications include environmental reports assessing potential environmental impacts from license renewal activities. One such impact would be effects of license renewal activities on threatened and endangered species that are listed or proposed for listing in accordance with the Endangered Species Act (ESA) (16 USC 1531, et seq.) (10 CFR 51.53(c)(3)(ii)(E)). Accordingly, we are contacting you to obtain input for use in addressing these effects in the LGS license renewal environmental report. Later, NRC may also request an informal consultation with your office under Section 7 of the ESA (16 USC 1536(a)).

Project Features

LGS existing features that are relevant to the effects of license renewal on threatened and endangered species include the following:

 The LGS plant site, which hosts the two generating units, is located on Exelon Generation-owned properties that are mostly situated in Limerick Township, Montgomery County, but some of which are in the adjacent Lower Pottsgrove Township, Montgomery County or directly across the Schuylkill River in East Coventry Township, Chester County.

- 2. The LGS makeup water supply system, which conveys water from approved sources to LGS for use in its circulating water system, is composed of the following components:
 - The Perkiomen Pumphouse, located in Graterford Township, Montgomery County, and an associated underground 7.6-mile long Perkiomen Pumphouse-to-LGS pipeline; both are located along an easement held by Exelon Generation within an electrical transmission line right-of-way (ROW) controlled by PECO, a subsidiary of Exelon Corporation:
 - The Bradshaw Reservoir and Bradshaw Pumphouse, which are both situated in Plumstead Township, Bucks County, on Exelon Generation-owned properties totaling 42 acres;
 - The Bedminster Water Processing Facility, which is situated in Bedminster Township, Bucks County, on a 3-acre Exelon Generation-owned property; and
 - An underground water transmission main, which is routed within a natural gas
 pipeline ROW along an easement held by Exelon Generation that runs from the
 Bradshaw Pumphouse to the East Branch Perkiomen Creek by way of the
 Bedminster Facility.

The buried Perkiomen Pumphouse-to-LGS water pipeline and the underground water transmission main are located below ground within ROWs that exist for other purposes, and their operation requires no independent vegetation management or ground disturbing activities along these ROWs. Hence, these underground components of the makeup water supply system are assumed to have no effects on threatened and endangered plant species.

- 3. The LGS transmission system is composed of the following components:
 - Two electrical transmission lines constructed to connect the LGS main power transformers with two onsite electrical substations (these components are located on the LGS plant site); and
 - Four 230-kiloVolt (kV) and one 500-kV electrical transmission lines, with associated structures and offsite electrical substations, constructed to connect the onsite electrical substations to the regional electricity grid.

All offsite substations and transmission lines are operated by PECO and are located in ROWs situated in Montgomery and Chester Counties either on PECO-owned properties or on properties for which PECO holds permits, grants, easements, or licenses. Onsite transmission lines traverse only land disturbed during initial station construction.


Figure 1	LGS Plant Site Property Boundaries

Figures 1 through 9 showing the locations of the existing LGS project features are provided in Attachment 3.

Activities During the License Renewal Terms

LGS license renewal will involve no new construction, refurbishment, ground disturbing activities, changes to operations, or changes to existing land-use conditions. Operation and maintenance activities during the terms of the renewed LGS licenses are only expected to occur in previously disturbed areas or existing ROWs. Hence, no new adverse impacts to threatened and endangered species are anticipated from license renewal.

Identification of Threatened and Endangered Species Resources

Using the Pennsylvania Natural Diversity Inventory (PNDI) Environmental Review Tool, a web-based application sponsored by the Pennsylvania Natural Heritage Program (PNHP), Exelon Generation has reviewed the potential for the LGS plant site area and the properties associated with the LGS makeup water supply system to adversely affect known occurrences of species or natural communities of concern. Receipts for PNDI search #s 20100421240174 (LGS plant site), 20100421240163 (Perkiomen Pumphouse area), 20100406237563 (Bradshaw Reservoir and Pumphouse area), and 20100407237630 (Bedminster Water Processing Facility area) are attached (Attachment 1). Two species under the jurisdiction of the PFBC were identified for the LGS plant site: one sensitive species (unidentified) with threatened status and the Pizzini's cave amphipod (*Stygobromus pizzinii*) with "special concern species" status. Also, one sensitive species (unidentified) with threatened status under the jurisdiction of the PFBC was identified for the Bradshaw Reservoir and Pumphouse location. The responses for the other project sites stated that no impact is anticipated to threatened and endangered species and/or special concern species or resources.

Given the sizable acreage and distances associated with the LGS transmission line corridors, no PNDI searches were conducted for this project component. For review by your office in identifying species of concern, we instead offer the figures in Attachment 3 showing the routes and widths of the corridors.

A review of the PNHP web site for state-listed endangered and threatened species indicates that a number of state-listed reptile and amphibian, fish, and invertebrate species could occur in Montgomery, Chester, and Bucks Counties. The enclosed Attachment 2 contains a list of these species. One amphibian species, the bog turtle (*Glyptemys muhlenbergii*), state-listed as endangered with recorded locations in the three counties of interest, also is federally-listed as threatened. Two fish species, the shortnose sturgeon (*Acipenser brevirostrum*) and the Atlantic sturgeon (*Acipenser oxyrinchus*), which are state-listed as endangered with Bucks County as their recorded locations, also are federally-listed as endangered and candidate species, respectively. One invertebrate species, the dwarf wedgemussel (*Alasmidonta heterodon*), state-listed as endangered with recorded locations in the three counties of interest, also is federally-listed as endangered. Exelon Generation is not aware that these or any other state-listed reptile and amphibian, fish, or invertebrate species are present on or near the properties associated with LGS or its associated transmission lines.

Because license renewal involves no new construction, refurbishment, ground disturbing activities, changes to operation, or changes to existing land use conditions, Exelon Generation does not expect LGS license renewal to adversely affect threatened and endangered reptile and amphibian, fish, and invertebrate species located near the LGS plant site, makeup water supply system, or transmission system ROWs. Nevertheless, we are requesting your help to identify the two unidentified sensitive species under PFBC jurisdiction that were identified by our PNDI searches, as well as other issues we may have overlooked that need to be addressed in the LGS license renewal environmental report. We are also interested in learning of any information your staff believes could help expedite the NRC's review of the LGS license renewal application. Hence, in closing, we would appreciate receiving a response from you detailing the requested information for the LGS plant site, makeup water supply system and transmission system. We would also welcome your confirmation of our conclusion that LGS license renewal would not adversely affect threatened and endangered reptile and amphibian, fish, and invertebrate species.

Dear Ms. RANEK:

The staff of the Natural Diversity Section has examined the map accompanying your recent correspondence which shows the location of the above referenced project. Based on records maintained in the Pennsylvania Natural Diversity Inventory (PNDI) database and Pennsylvania Fish & Boat Commission files, the eastern redbelly turtle (Pseudemys rubriventris, PA threatened) and globally rare amphipod and/or isopod species are known from the vicinity of the project sites.

The eastern redbelly turtle is one of Pennsylvania's largest native aquatic turtles. This turtle species is known to inhabit relatively large, deep streams, rivers, ponds, lakes and marshes with permanent water and ample basking sites. Redbelly turtles are restricted to the southcentral and southeastern regions of the Commonwealth. The existence of this turtle species is threatened by habitat destruction, poor water quality and competition with aggressive non-native turtle species that share its range and habitat (e.g., red-eared slider, Trachemys scripta elegans).

Isopods and amphipods are small invertebrate species (crustaceans) that inhabit coldwater springs, seeps, on hillsides and in caves. Although these species are not listed as candidate, threatened, or endangered, they may be listed in the not so distant future. These rare invertebrate species are threatened by habitat destruction and poor water quality.

Given that the proposed license renewal will involve no new construction, earth disturbance, or changes to existing land uses, I do not anticipate the proposed activity to have any significant adverse impacts to the species of concern under PFBC jurisdiction.

Note that this office performed no field inspection of the project area. Consequently, comments in this letter are not meant to address other issues or concerns that might arise concerning matters under Pennsylvania Fish and Boat Commission jurisdiction or that of other authorities.
