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NRC to Hold an Additional Online Meeting to Receive Comments on Indian Point Nuclear Plant Decommissioning Activities Report

The Nuclear Regulatory Commission staff will conduct an additional virtual meeting on Aug. 18 to discuss and receive comments regarding a decommissioning roadmap report for the Indian Point nuclear power plant.

On July 29, the staff held a hybrid meeting in Tarrytown, New York, with a phone line available for those who opted not to attend in person. However, local storms and technical issues resulted in remote participants encountering audio problems. In order to ensure all who are interested have an opportunity to provide comments on the Post-Shutdown Decommissioning Activities Report, a virtual meeting will be held beginning at 4 p.m. Eastern time on Aug. 18.

The meeting will be conducted via the WebEx videostreaming platform using this [link](#). A phone line will be used for the audio portion by calling 1-888-989-9738, passcode: 2331350#.

During the meeting, NRC staff will present information on regulatory reviews and oversight of the plant during decommissioning prior to taking public comments.

Holtec, which owns the Buchanan, New York, facility, submitted a [Post-Shutdown Decommissioning Activities Report](#) for Indian Point on Dec. 19, 2019. The NRC staff did not begin a formal review of the plan until the company officially acquired the plant from Entergy in late May of this year. Among other matters, it describes the company's plans to use the DECON, or immediate dismantlement, approach and complete the radiological decommissioning of the site within about 15 years.
